Locally Developed Courses

Disbursement of remaining School Nutrition Grant dollars

Of the original \$249,000 school nutrition grant assigned to Oscar Adolphson and Harry Gray Elementary schools in Budget 2019-20, there is a balance of approximately \$49,000. At the request of the Department of Education, these dollars are now being distributed to local food banks across the division based on student population. The distribution of remaining grant dollars will occur in two installments – the first on May 1 and the second on June 30.

At-Home Learning and Attendance

• At-Home Learning:

In-school classes were cancelled by the Alberta Government on March 15. Immediately, NGPS began planning and preparing to move to an online learning platform. While teachers connected with students and families, set up their Google Classrooms, assembled take home learning packages for each student to help bridge the gap in instruction during this time period, and prepared for a virtual learning environment, other staff worked diligently behind the scenes to keep students and parents informed, ensure a safe and coordinated pick up of student belongings and ensure technology access and support for students.

NGPS Superintendent, Kevin Andrea, commended school staff and administrators for their work and adaptability throughout the pandemic to date.

Teachers have taken a variety of approaches to remote instruction and engagement depending on their own experience and the experience of their students. All students in Kindergarten to Grade 12 have continued to receive learning opportunities at home, either through online means or through other accommodations. Alberta Education's Content Delivery Guidelines have directed how students will learn while in-school classes are canceled.

Learning at home is not an equivalent to classroom/school day learning. The goal is to provide access to instruction and support for students and families while in-school classes are cancelled.

Parents are not expected to deliver the same learning that students receive at school, but to do whatever they can to encourage and support learning for their children while classes are cancelled.

• Attendance:

Different students are working on their at-home learning in different ways. Most students are engaging in the digital learning environment, although there are a few families who have requested paper packages. NGPS has an overall at-home learning attendance average of 77.89%. Many factors support engagement and attendance including access to technology and at-home support from family. Superintendent Andrea emphasized the importance of attendance and engagement for all students.
