3 Year Education Plan and 2017-18 Education Results

STUDENT PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHTS

- The Division scored High or Very High on 7 of Alberta Education's 15 accountability measures including Safe and Caring, High School Completion, School Improvement, Parent Involvement and Citizenship.
- Targeted work and professional development in Numeracy and Literacy over the past year has yielded positive gains in student results
- The Division is on par with the province in Education Quality.
- Provincial Achievement Test (PAT) results were maintained and are on par with the province.
- Diploma Examination results demonstrate improvement scoring on par with the province in Overall Acceptable Standards.
- NGPS remains above the Provincial Average on all First Nations, Métis and Inuit results.
- Significant improvements in Math 30-1 and Math 30-2 results have been achieved.
- Improvement on the First Nations Métis Inuit Drop Out rate (a decrease of 2.3%).

- the development of Math Networks among Grades 9-12
- a contracted instructional coach for Grades 1-12 to enhance teaching practices
- a continued support for participation in field testing and Diploma exam marking

LITERACY

- instructional coaching to enhance teaching practices
- continued support of the Highest Level of Achievement Testing, training in Fountas and Pinnell Reading Assessments
- the establishment of Literacy Leads in each school to assist in developing comprehensive Literacy cultures in NGPS schools

Northern Gateway Public Schools fosters program-rich, quality learning environments where students, teachers and our greater communities can do their best work together. Catering to just under 5,000 learners from pre-Kindergarten to Grade 12, we operate 16 schools, four colony schools, and four off-campus outreach schools.
