

Board Policy 15 School Operational Viability

The Board believes that all schools be annually reviewed for their operational viability.

Specifically

- 1. Each year prior to November 30, the Superintendent shall present to the Board a review of the operational viability of each school.
- 2. The Superintendent shall include in the review of the operational viability of each school the following criteria:
 - 2.1 That the facility provides a healthy and safe environment for students, staff, and public;
 - 2.2 That the September 30 enrolment is not less than fifty percent (50%) of the facility space utilization rate as defined by the provincial government;
 - 2.3 That the school is able to deliver a fulsome education program within the framework of the provincial funding model, additional funding as would be reasonable in the next annual Division budget, and external support.
 - 2.4 That continued operation of the school facility would create excessive costs to the Division, specifically capital improvements, repairs, and utilities.
- 3. The Superintendent shall include in the operational viability review recommendations that address:
 - 3.1 Continuation of a school; and/or
 - 3.2 Action required to improve a school's operational viability, including the transfer of students to another facility.
- 4. Further, if two (2) or more of the above mentioned criteria are not met, the Superintendent may recommend a further study of the possibility of school closure.





- 5. The Board shall act on the school operational viability recommendations by resolution during the Board meeting at which the recommendations are presented.
- 6. When the Board resolves to study the possibility of school closure or the discontinuation of grade levels in a school, the Superintendent shall prepare the study which will include the information on the following:
 - 6.1 Present and projected enrolment;
 - 6.2 Education program being offered;
 - 6.3 Availability of classroom space at receiving school(s);
 - 6.4 Transportation factors;
 - 6.5 Operational costs;
 - 6.6 The age and condition of the building; and
 - 6.7 Other unique circumstances.
- 7. The Superintendent shall present the study to the Board at the first regular Board meeting following the presentation of the annual operational review.
- 8. The Board shall respond by resolution to the study at the meeting the study is presented.
