Alana Simpson also reported that the current Daycare space will be expanding to another classroom as they are at capacity and have a wait list.

2. Tammy Ethier, on behalf of the Community of Sangudo, provided written materials to the Trustees and Administration and gave a PowerPoint presentation regarding the plan by NGPS to move the junior high program from the Sangudo Community School to Mayerthorpe Jr/Sr High.

Trustees clarified the references in the presentation to the Education Act and discussed inequity in funding.

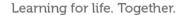

Trustees recommended that the agreements ease access to facilities and requested that local Trustees be invited to participate in discussions with communities during the process. Superintendent Bird will provide 'base' agreements for discussion purposes.

Pam Mehl, Lead Teacher/Trip Coordinator and Brent Northcott, Principal, from Hilltop High School joined the meeting virtually to discuss details and highlights of the proposed 2024 D-Day 80: Juno and the Road to Liberation International Field Trip to Netherlands, Belgium, and France. Dates are May 31 to June 8, 2024. Learning on the trip will be directly related to modules in English, Social Studies, Science, Photography and Communications, and credit will be earned.

The trip cost is higher due to rising insurance, food and accommodation costs. The travel company allows monthly payments to help with budgeting, and students can reduce costs through fundraising.

Trustee Hailes requested that the students prepare a presentation for the Trustees upon return from their trip.

Superintendent Bird presented information from his report regarding his recommendation to transfer junior high students from Sangudo to Mayerthorpe.

Moved by Trustee Deb Koloski: That the NGPS Board of Education direct the Superintendent to not enact a transfer of students at Sangudo Community School until the 2024 – 25 school year at the earliest, and to only enact a transfer after this date, in order to preserve the school's viability.

Trustee Koloski commented that the community has worked hard to keep the school viable and requested that the Board honour the timeline in its first motion (4540-21).

The Trustees had round table discussion:

- A goal/target is needed in order to continue the junior high program
- Daycare does not affect funding, but benefit is that students may continue through other grades
- The school needs to be viable, K 6 program would keep it viable and allow focus on the elementary program
- Trustees would like more time to consider the pros and cons more information is needed
- The Capital Plan includes modernization of the school. The K-6 plan was created with the intent to keep the school open indefinitely

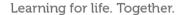
The Trustees had concern with the wording of the motion and requested a recess to discuss and recommend an amendment.

Motion Amendment: Moved by Trustee Deb Koloski: That the Board continue to operate the Sangudo Community School as a K- 9 school, from 2023 – 2025, barring any extraordinary circumstances that would require additional program funding beyond the 2021 – 2022 allotment.

Further discussion by the Trustees:

- The motion supports two more years, until the end of the 2024 25 school year
- The motion ties the hands of the Superintendent regarding funding
- Need to work with the community and have continual and intentional dialogue and consultation to keep the Board updated
- Need to indicate the Board's intent before spring break and work through the details later
- The new motion restates the original motion to keep the school operating until 2025.
