Board Advocacy Action Plan

The Board Advocacy Committee presented a new Advocacy Plan for the Board focusing on the following priorities:

- Equitable funding for rural education;
- transportation funding for driver wages;
- capital funding model based on regular, sustainable funding for school divisions;
- support for contracted positions that support kids in NGPS schools, i.e. occupational therapist, psychological services.

Motion to approve the Board Advocacy Plan 2024 as presented. Motion approved.

Locally Developed Courses

Dance 15, 25 and 35, courses developed by Edmonton Public Schools, were approved for use within the division.

Developed by other school divisions, and utilized at zero cost by other schools and school divisions, these courses provide additional learning opportunities for NGPS students.

Critical Incident Response

The Division uses Hour Zero, a comprehensive safety and critical response resource, to guide critical incident responses as needed.

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Threat, grief and loss response is managed through the Centre for Trauma Informed Practice, or CTIP. Division staff and administration receive comprehensive training through CTIP.

Threat making behavior results in a Violence Threat Risk Assessment (VTRA). A VTRA process involves local agencies and a set series of steps that are followed for every incident. <u>Learn more about VTRA</u>.
