# Percy Baxter Middle School (PBS) Cultural Exchange Program

NGPS Superintendent Kevin Bird shared highlights from Percy Baxter Middle School's 2025 Cultural Exchange experience, which saw Grade 8 students travel to Ontario and later host Ontario students here at home. Facilitated through the Canadian Sports and Friendship Exchange Program (CSFEP), the initiative is designed to build meaningful connections, broaden students' perspectives, and deepen their understanding of Canada's diverse regions. Students took part in a variety of enriching activities and formed lasting friendships with their peers from another province. The school hopes to continue the program this year, with support once again expected from the funding organization and through local fundraising efforts.

The Board motioned to approve in principle the Cultural Exchange Program for Percy Baxter for May and June 2026. Motion carried.

#### National Day for Truth and Reconciliation

In classrooms, gymnasiums and community spaces across the Division, students explore Indigenous teachings, connect with the land, and reflect on the truths of our shared history.
